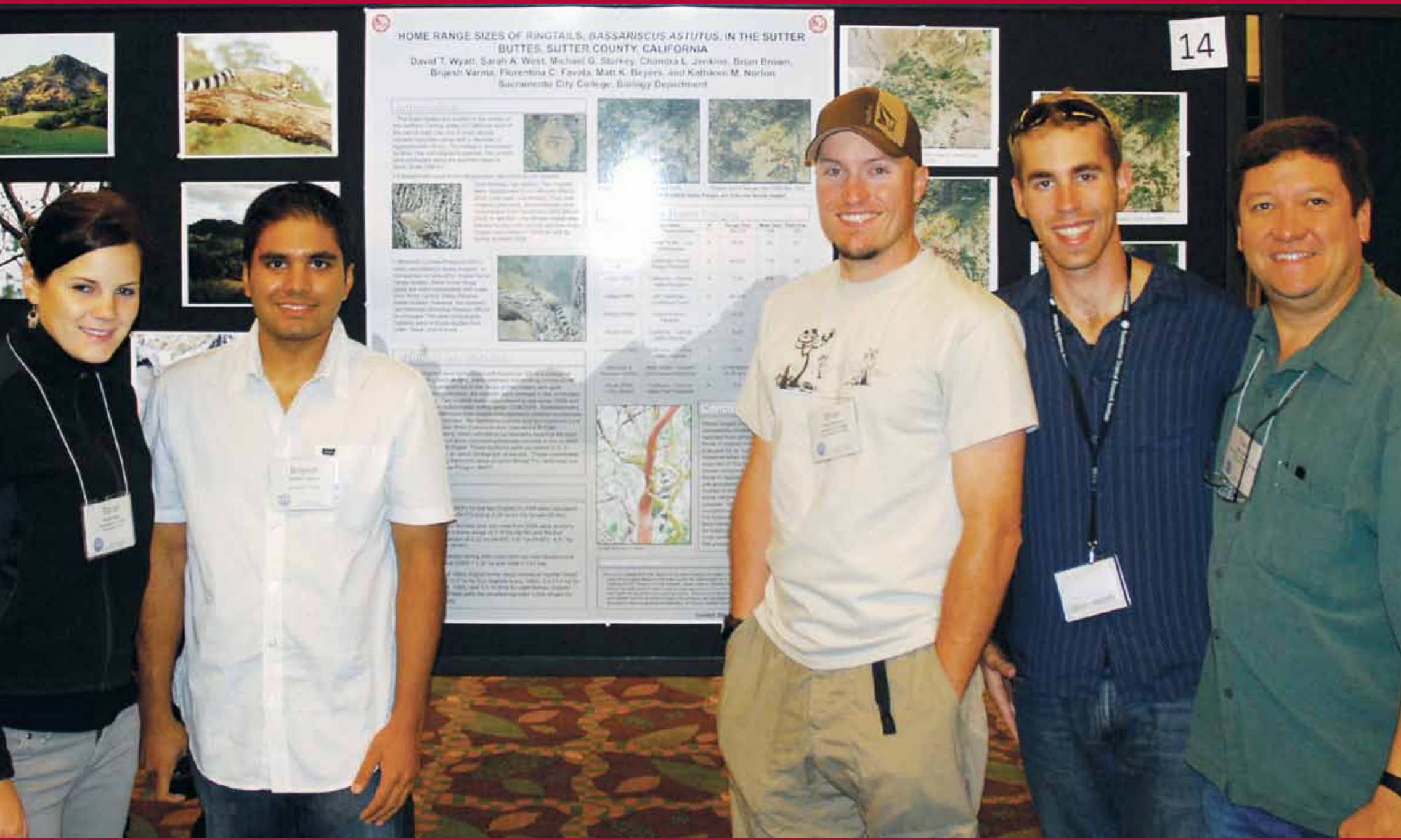

iClickers for the Classroom: *The clickers are part of a response system that tracks students understanding of class material.*

Clickers are distributed to students to use in classroom discussion and tests. After being asked a question by the instructor, students respond with their clickers. The instructor then knows how well the class is interpreting the material. This keeps students engaged in

class discussion and lets them know how well they understand the material.
