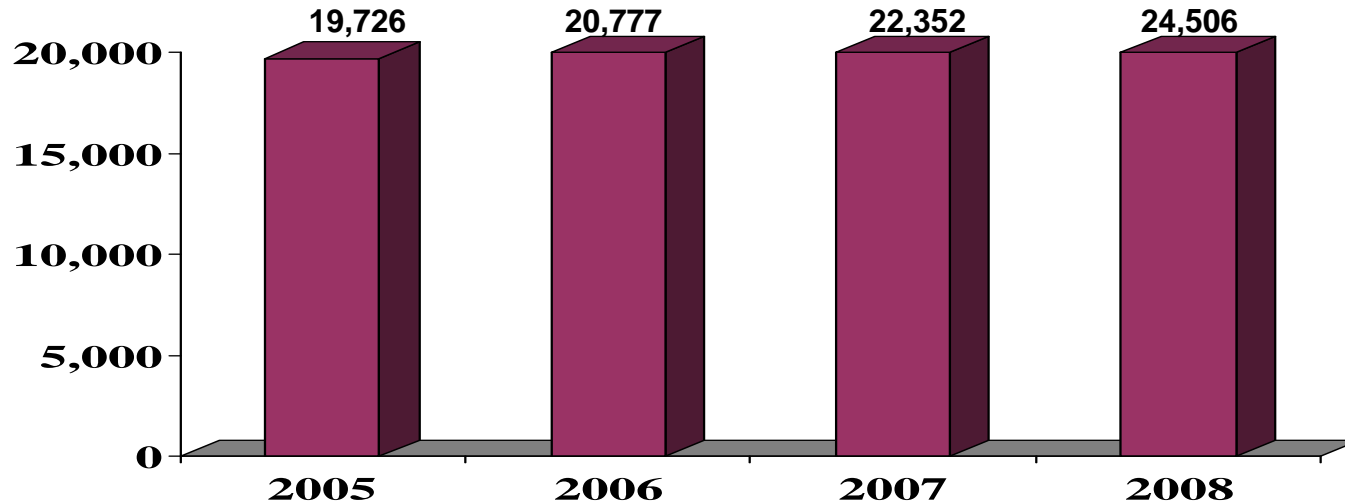

Fall 2005 to 2008



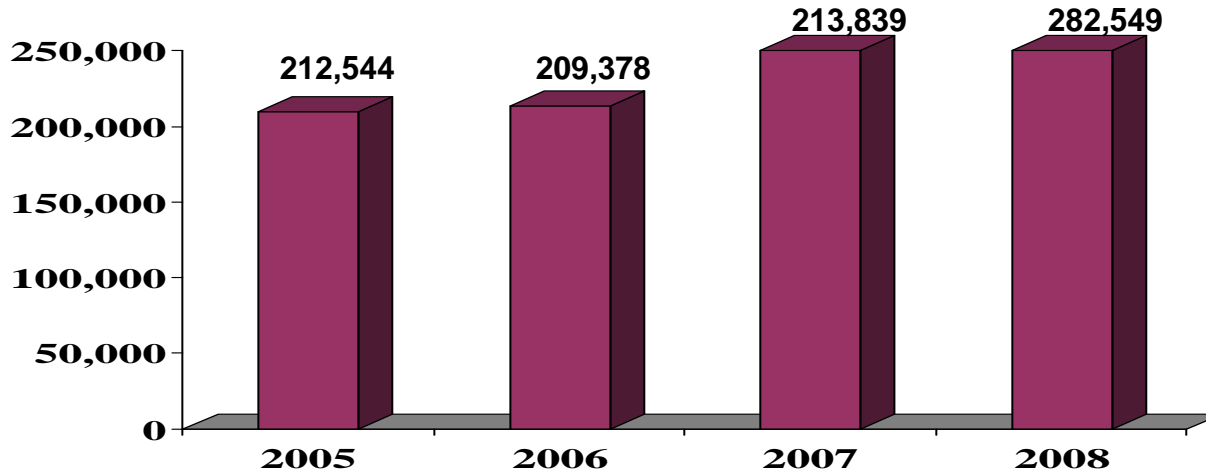

Fall 2005 to 2008

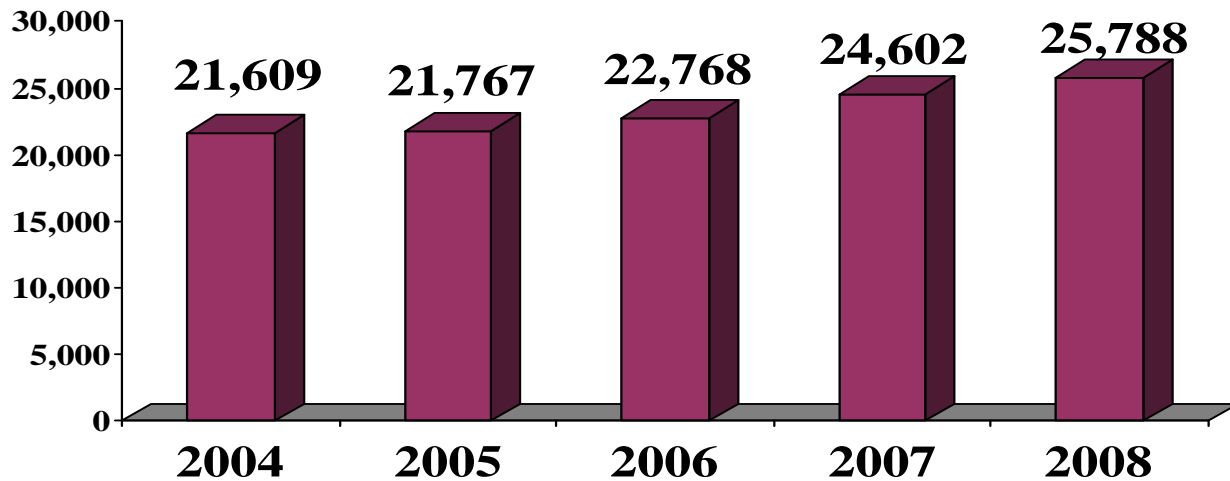

# Enrollment Trends By End of Semester Headcount      Fall 2004 to 2008

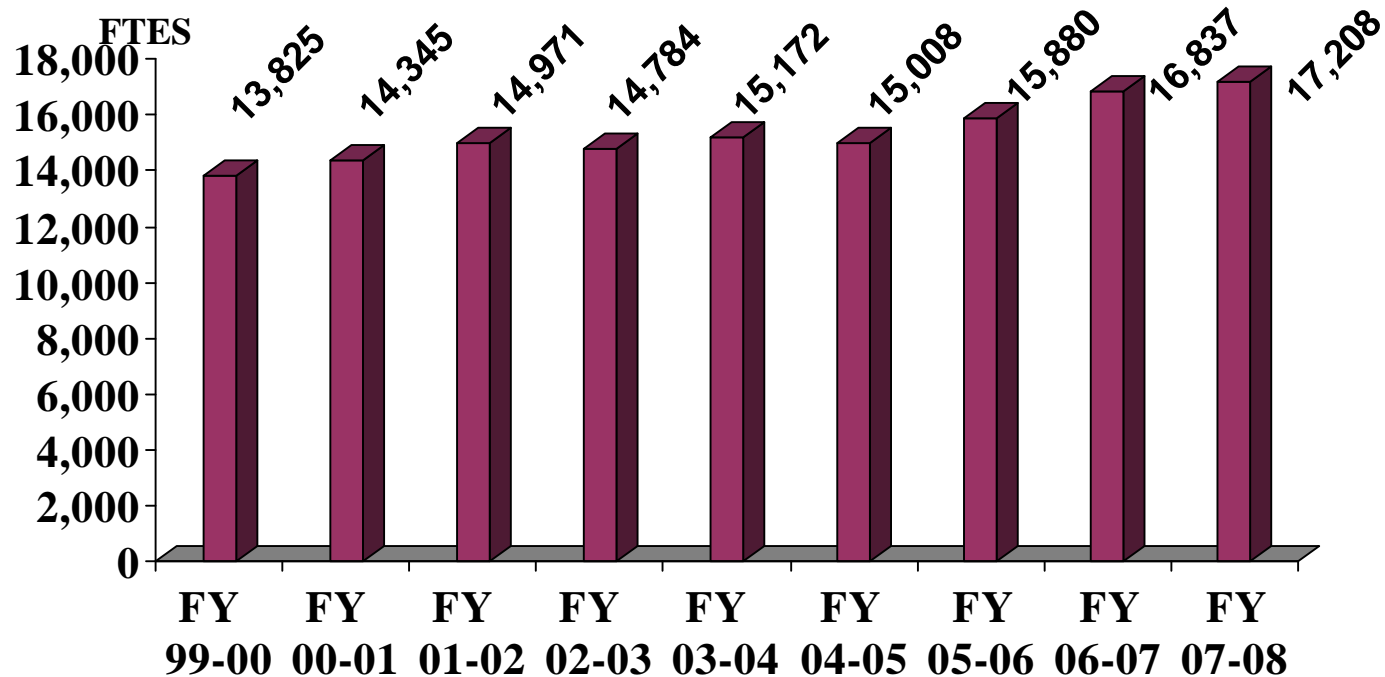

FY 1999 - FY 2007



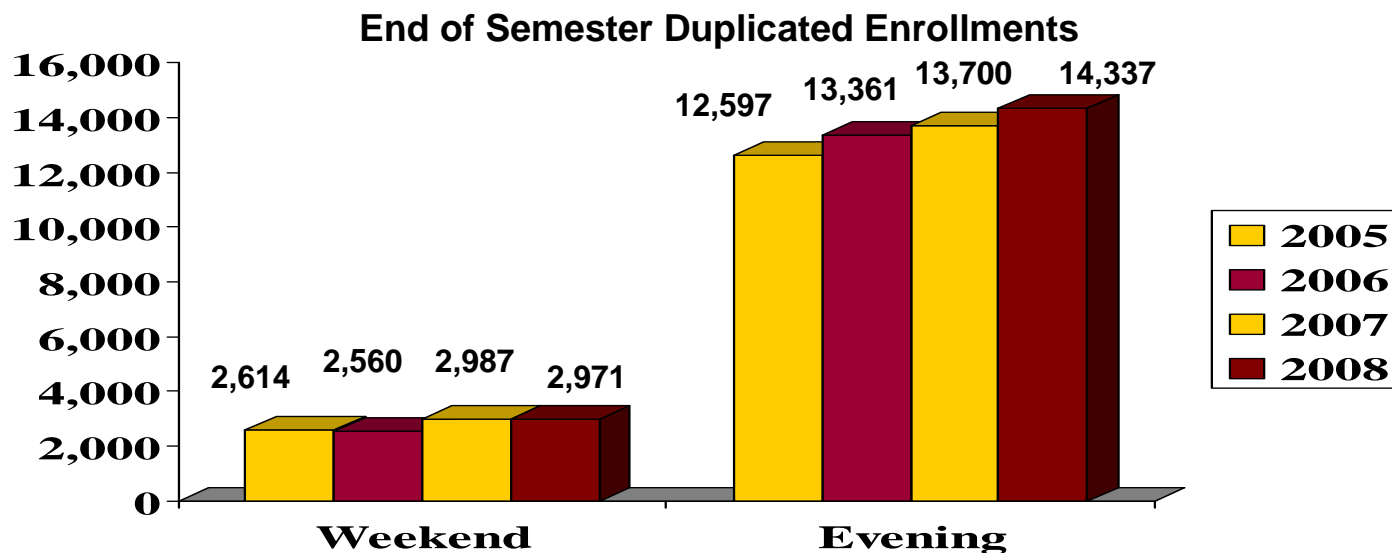

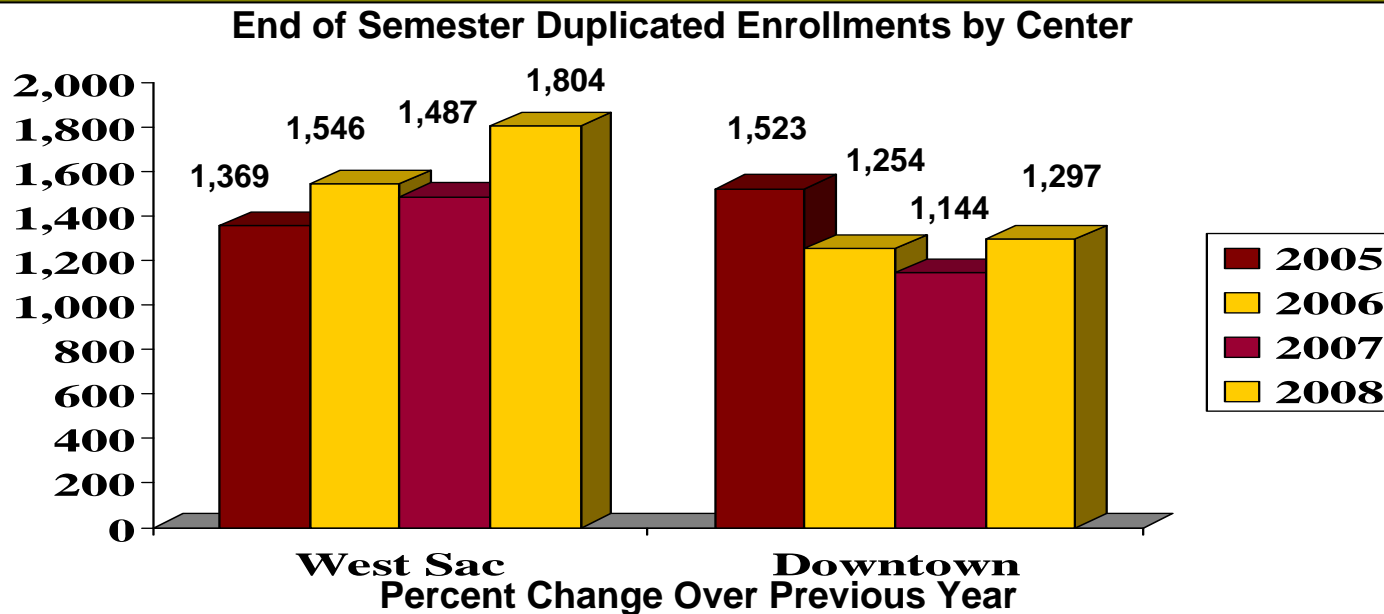

Fall 2005 to 2008

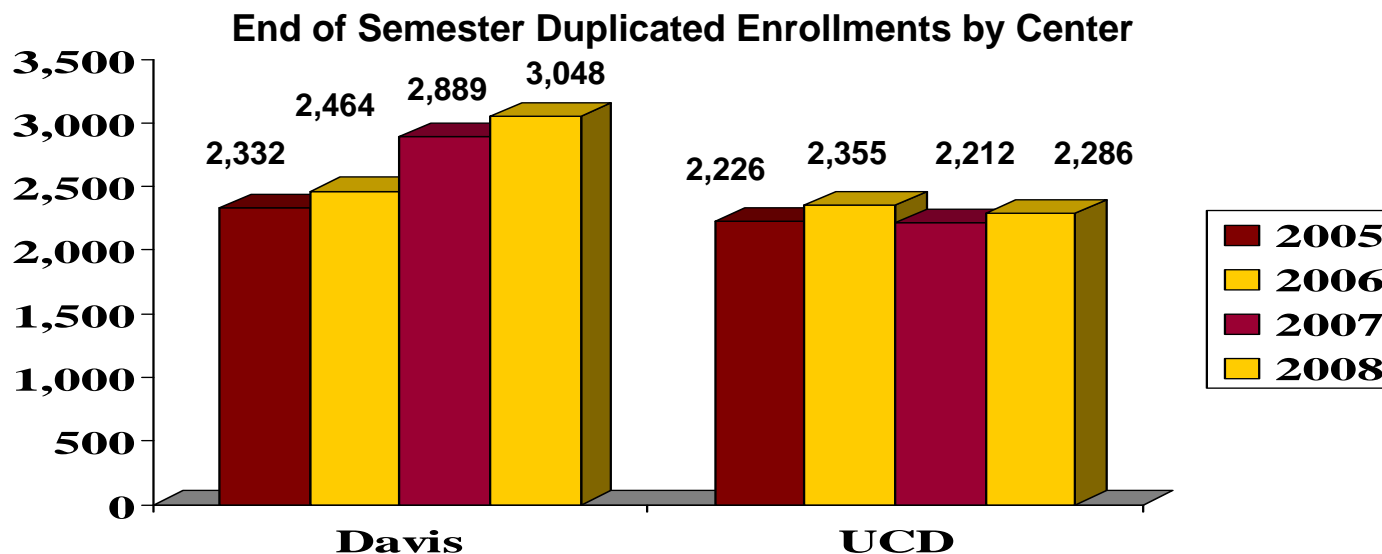

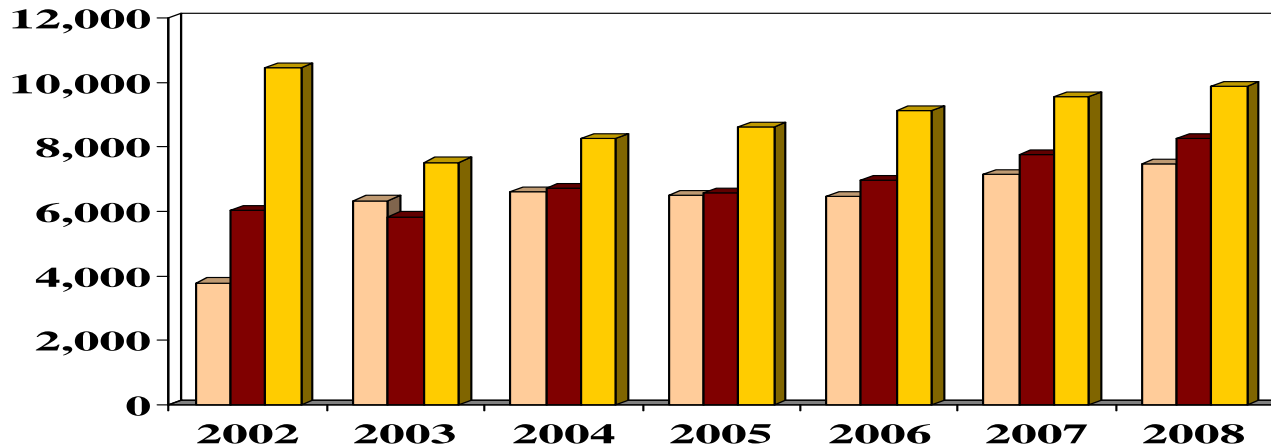

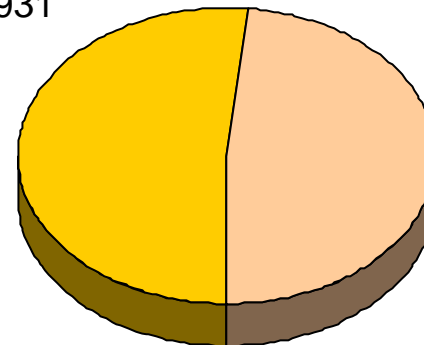

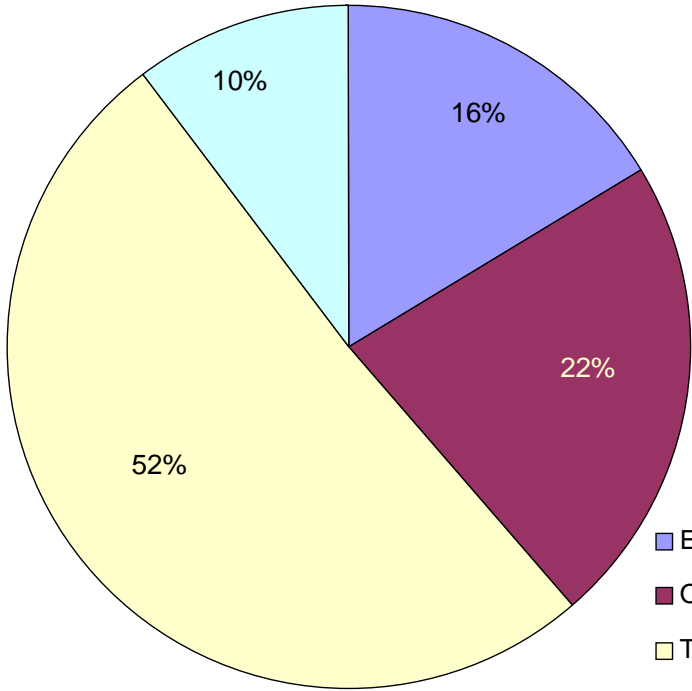

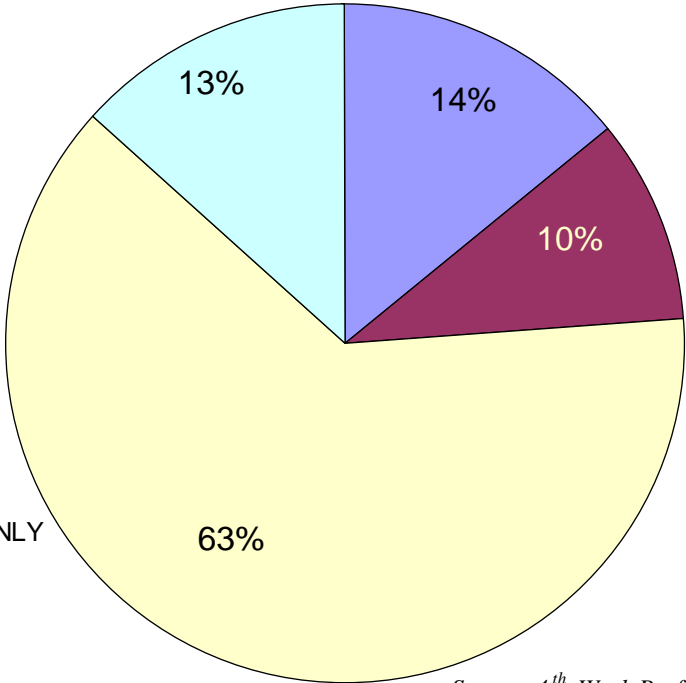

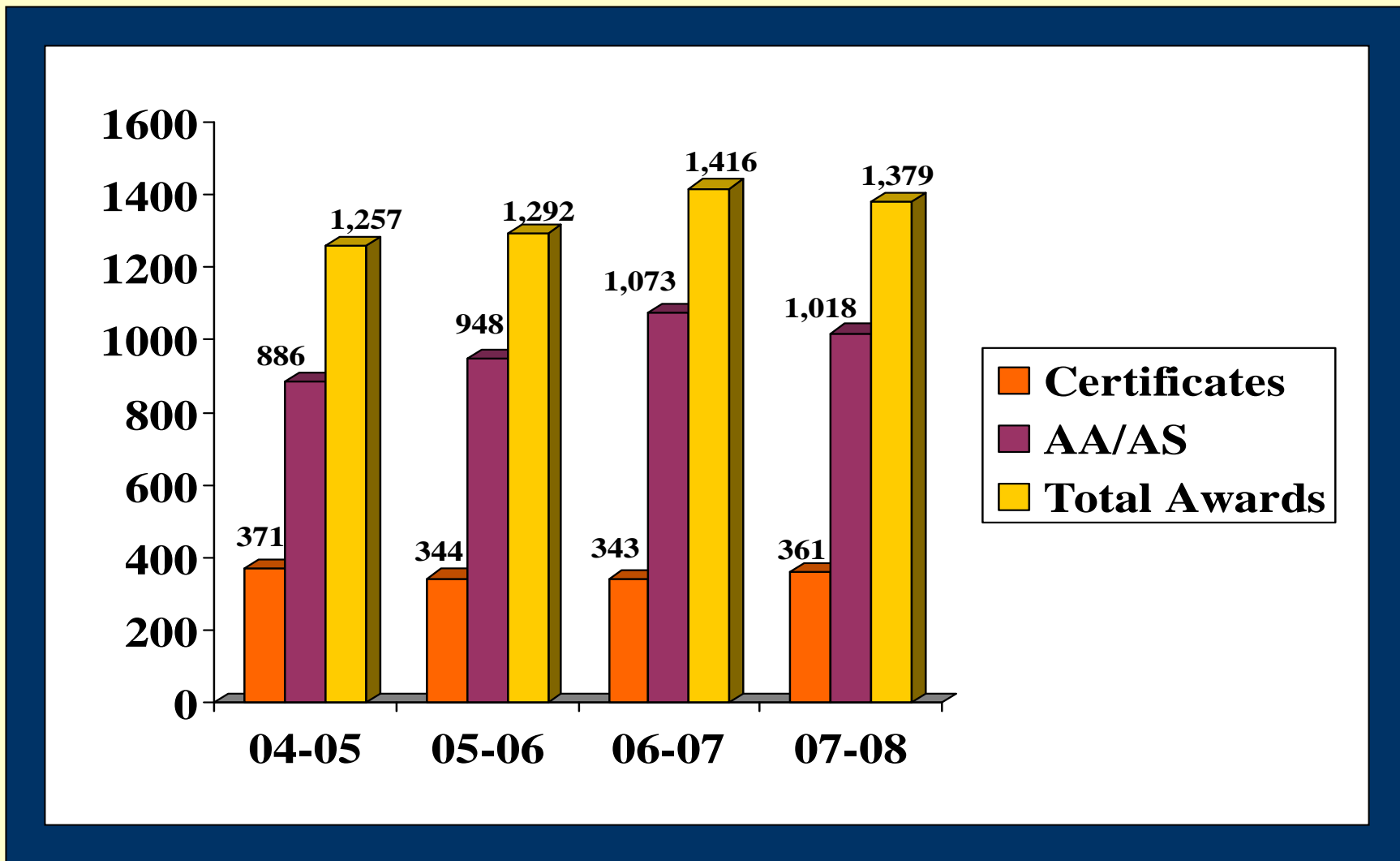

## Academic Year 2004-05 to 2007-08

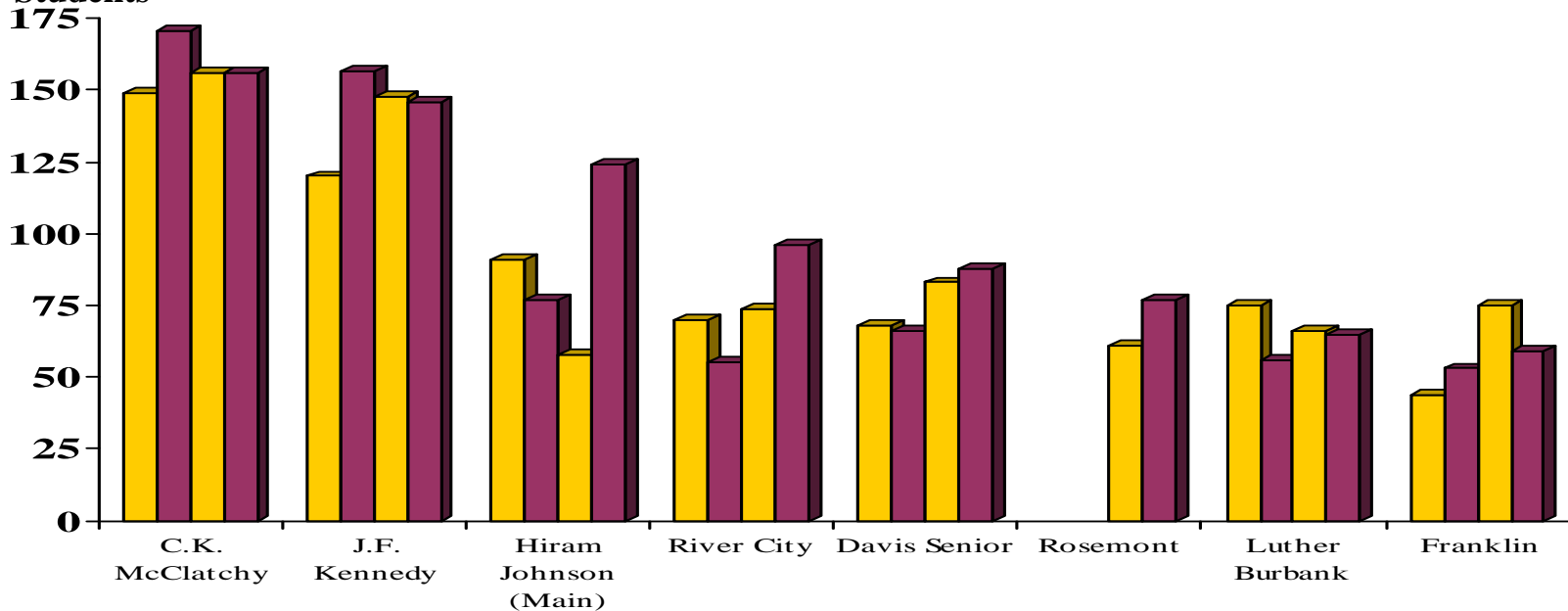

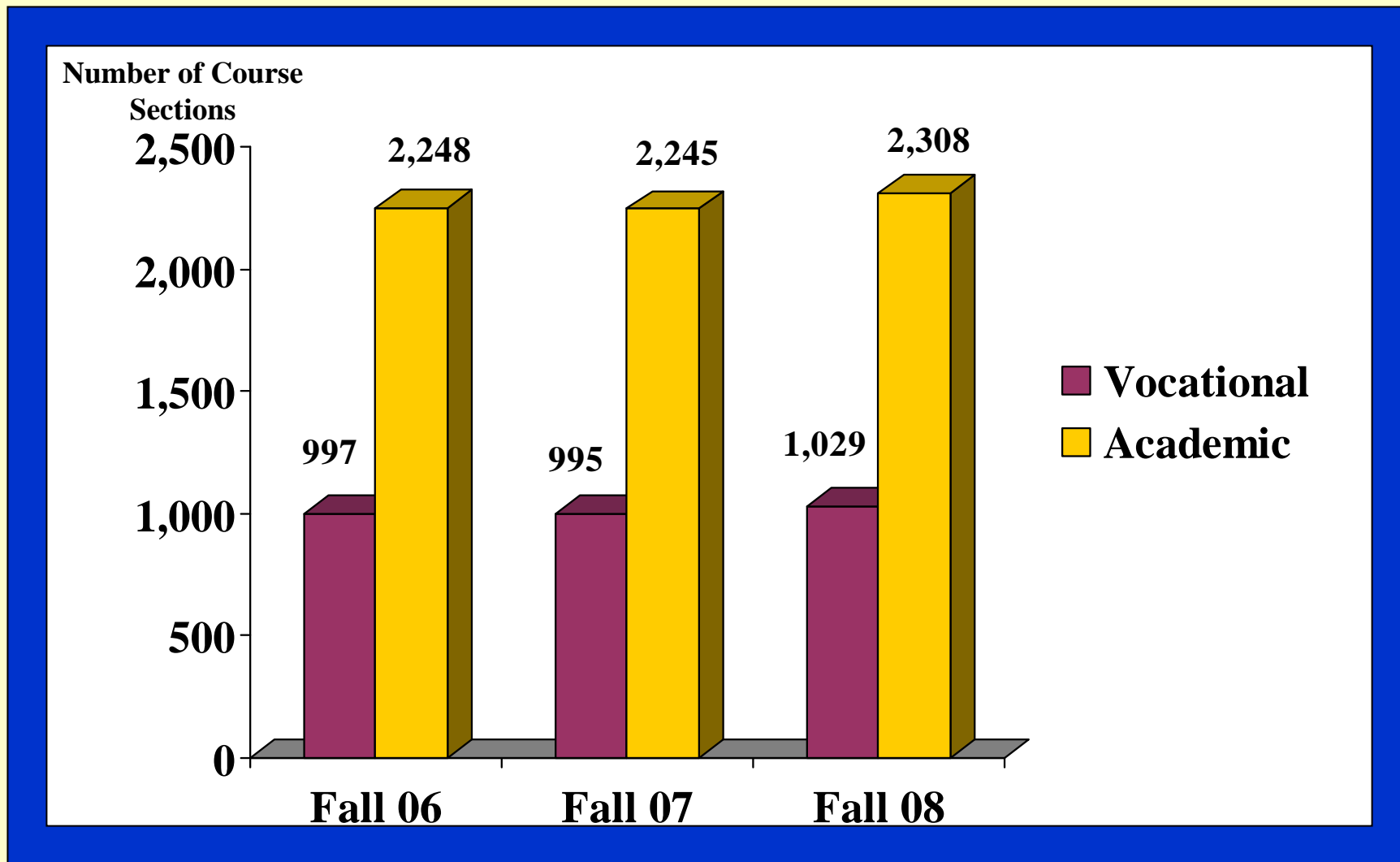
